Richland Airport Entrance Archway Planned for 2019



Last year, the Port's Richland Airport was awarded Washington Airport Management Association Project of the Year. The next phase of airport enhancements include a new archway with an artistic silhouette of the "Day's Pay" B-17 Bomber. The aircraft pays tribute to the area's history. The B-17 was paid for by a day's pay from every employee at the Hanford Engineer Works in 1944 in support of World War II.


Sundance Aviation Expands: The Port continues to partner with Sundance Aviation, the fixed-base operator at the Richland Airport. Sundance plans to lease an additional 14,400-square-foot building for avionics, turbine repair and maintenance services. Sundance has been a key factor in the growth of the airport since moving on-site 14 years ago.

The Port of Benton strives to keep its tax levy rate as low as possible. In the past 10 years, the rate has decreased by 11 percent. Currently, Port District homeowners pay annual property taxes of \$37.39 per \$100,000 in assessed home value to the Port of Benton.

The center features more than 6,000 square feet of event space for private parties, weddings, and corporate meetings and is home to the Legends of Washington Wine Hall of Fame.
